
# Reading Recommendations for **Black History Month**






In 1920s Pittsburgh, Ophelia moves in with relatives after her father's death and discovers she can see ghosts.

The posthumously published Run is a follow up to the award-winning March trilogy about Lewis' days in the Civil Rights Movement.






