# Enhance your research using magazine archives




Magazine archives are primary sources that help you expand your research topics with unique accounts of historical events, political trends and evolving culture.

## Use magazine archives to:

- Access first issues of magazines to get the full scope of historical content and track the evolution of trends
- Find first-hand accounts of historical and cultural events as witnessed by different populations
- Supplement research across subjects with interviews and observations from journalists
- Explore visual content such as photographs, advertisements and illustrations
- Gain insights into historical timelines through the chronological structure of magazine issues






### **Keyword Search & Results**

- 1 Search Bar: Enter your term or topic to search magazine archives available through the library.
- 2 Advanced Search: Limit your results to search by content type, publication or date.
- **Quick Filters:** Refine a search using filters without navigating away from results.
- 4 Sort Results: Organize results by relevance or date.

- **Save Search:** Save current search or create search alerts.
- **Access Full Text:** View articles as they originally appeared in the magazine.
- 7 **My Dashboard:** Log in to save articles, view search history and organize resources by project.
- 8 Research Tools: Access publications and additional sources.

- A **Advertisement Search:** Use advanced search filters to find advertisements in a magazine.
- B PDF Full Text: Click to access the advertisement as it appears in the magazine.
