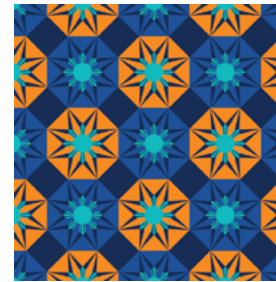
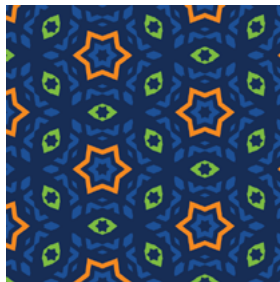

MUSLIM AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

Muslim American Heritage Month celebrates Americans of Muslim heritage and their contributions to American society. This month celebrates the work of key cultural icons such as boxer Muhammad Ali and Ahmet Ertegun, the founder of Atlantic Records and the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. Many who celebrate this month choose to participate in music or arts festivals, watch films created by or featuring Muslim Americans, and dig into cuisine such as baba ghanoush or tabbouli.

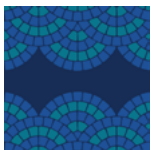
February:



BLACK HISTORY MONTH –

Black History Month acknowledges the achievements and contributions of African Americans, including prominent Black authors such as Toni Morrison, James Baldwin, and Maya Angelou. Cultural events often take place like local Black history museum exhibitions or virtual talks and panel discussions, featuring influential Black voices. Many choose to support Black-owned businesses by dining at Black-owned restaurants, purchasing products from Black artisans, or using services from Black entrepreneurs.

GREEK AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

Greek American Heritage Month highlights the contributions of Greek Americans, as well as celebrates Greek traditions, history and culture. With over 2.5 million Americans of Greek ancestry, there is a large community that celebrates this month by preparing authentic Greek cuisine, listening to Laikó music or practicing the traditional Greek dance called Zeibekiko.



IRISH AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

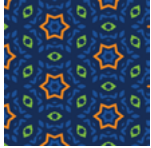
Irish American Heritage Month acknowledges the contributions of Irish Americans, including renowned Irish American authors such as Frank McCourt and Alice McDermott. St. Patrick's Day parades often feature traditional Irish music and dance performances, and Irish cultural centers or museums provide a way to learn about the history of Irish immigration and its impact on America.



WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH –

Women's History Month honors the contributions and achievements of women throughout history including the works of influential female authors such as Gloria Steinem, Simone de Beauvoir, and Zora Neale Hurston. Many events held during this month highlight women's history and accomplishments, such as lectures, film screenings, or panel discussions featuring prominent women leaders.

April:



ARAB AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

Arab American Heritage Month recognizes the contributions of Arab Americans including works by renowned Arab American authors such as Khaled Hosseini and Naomi Shihab Nye. Cultural festivals often showcase traditional Arab music, dance, and art. Popular Arab cuisine includes hummus, falafel, and baklava.

May:



HAITIAN HERITAGE MONTH –

May honors Haitian history, culture and people. Notable people from Haiti include artist Jean-Michel Basquiat and comedian Eric Andre. People of Haitian descent celebrate their pride through playing traditional music, cooking Haitian food, and speaking Creole. Cultural events such as Kanaval are also held to celebrate freedom and honor people's Haitian roots.



ASIAN AMERICAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER (AAPI) HERITAGE MONTH –

This month honors the history, traditions, and contributions of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders including authors such as Amy Tan, Viet Thanh Nguyen, and Ocean Vuong. AAPI culinary delights include sushi, pho, and poke. Cultural events or festivals often feature traditional performances such as hula dancing, taiko drumming, and Chinese lion dances.



JEWISH AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

Jewish American Heritage Month acknowledges the achievements of Jewish Americans including authors like Elie Wiesel, Philip Roth, and Dara Horn. Jewish community centers or synagogues often hold events to celebrate, such as Shabbat services, cultural festivals, and educational workshops. Jewish cuisine includes traditional dishes like challah, matzo ball soup, and latkes.

June:



CARIBBEAN AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

Caribbean American Heritage Month is a time to reflect on the rich culture, heritage, and contributions of Caribbean Americans including renowned Caribbean authors such as Jamaica Kincaid, Edwidge Danticat, and Derek Walcott. Engage by exploring Caribbean cuisine, such as jerk chicken, roti, and plantains, at local restaurants or by trying

traditional recipes at home. Cultural festivals often showcase the vibrant music and dance of the Caribbean, including reggae, calypso, and salsa by artists like Bob Marley, Celia Cruz, and Rihanna.



PRIDE MONTH –

Pride Month celebrates the LGBTQ+ community and its history. Events include local Pride parades, which often feature vibrant performances, speeches, and activities that promote LGBTQ+ visibility and rights. Influential LGBTQ+ figures include Audre Lorde, Harvey Milk, and Marsha P. Johnson.

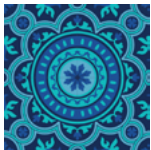
July:



FRENCH AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

Prominent Hispanic music artists and authors include Shakira, Celia Cruz, Isabel Allende, Junot Díaz, and Sandra Cisneros. Visit museums or exhibits that highlight the histories and achievements of Hispanic communities.

October:



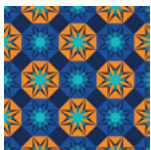
HINDU AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

This month includes traditional Hindu holidays like Diwali, the festival of lights, and Navaratri, the nine-day festival celebrating the Hindu deity Durga. ITALIAN AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

Italian American Heritage Month honors the vibrant cultural heritage and contributions of Italian Americans. Celebrate by indulging in Italian cuisine, such as classic dishes like pasta carbonara, risotto, and cannoli, at local Italian restaurants or by trying authentic recipes at home. Renowned Italian American authors include Mario Puzo and Don DeLillo. This month provides an opportunity to appreciate and celebrate the vibrant traditions and significant contributions of Italian Americans.



FILIPINO AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH –

Filipino American History Month recognizes and celebrates the contributions of Filipino Americans since the arrival of the first Filipinos in California in 1587. Many Filipino Americans served in World War II, so honoring Filipino veterans is one way to celebrate the Filipino American community this month. Celebrants can also dive into art, music, festivals and feasts to share their appreciation of Filipino culture.

NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH –

Native American Heritage Month honors Native American communities. Explore Native American cuisine, such as fry bread, bison burgers, and wild rice. Powwows and cultural festivals feature traditional music, dance, and storytelling. Influential Native American authors include Louise Erdrich, and Joy Harjo who provide deeper insights into their experiences and histories. Visit museums or cultural centers that showcase Native American artifacts, art, and historical exhibits.

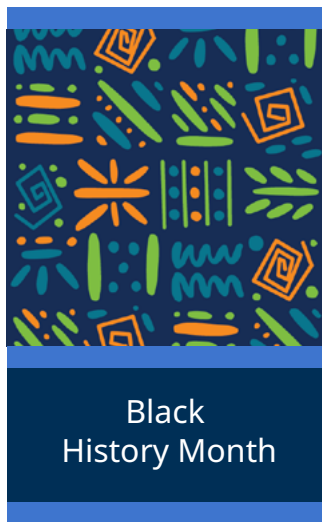

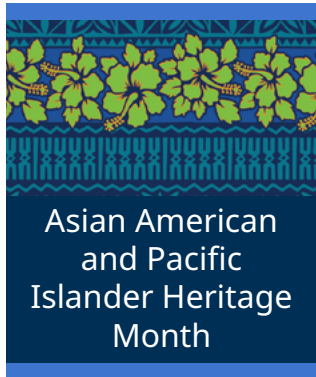
