No matter what genre you've chosen, track titles along with your thoughts about each book.

## November: DON'T JUST RELY ON SOCIAL MEDIA *and* LIBRARY EMAIL MARKETING

### Learning Tips

1

Think about how your learning supports your library's mission. This helps you see the bigger picture.

2

Connect course content to your own experiences. Ask yourself: Can this solve a challenge I'm facing?

3

Teaching others helps you learn. Share one insight from your course with a coworker.

4

Track your impact. After applying something from your course, take note of the results.

## December: NO MORE NEUTRAL *and* USING STORY ELEMENTS WITH READERS

### Learning Tips

1

At the end of your course, ask yourself: How can I use this in my library? A small action can reinforce what you've learned.

Learning doesn't have to be solo. Discuss courses with your coworkers afterward.

Finished the course? Learned something new? Take a moment to celebrate!

What's one thing you want to learn in the New Year? Set a goal for your next course or skill.
